Houses

Materials	Notes	Where does it go?
Newspapers and inserts, magazines, catalogs, telephone books, mixed office paper, mail and junk mail	Place in a brown paper sack. Must be dry.	All of these items can be placed (without sorting) into your blue cart or blue bag(s).
Cardboard boxes, chipboard (like cereal and tissue boxes). See below for corrugated cardboard.	Flatten all boxes to get more use of your cart.	
Steel, tin, and aluminum	Please rinse. It is helpful if you remove any paper labels.	
Plastic (1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7)		
Aerosol cans (non-hazardous)		
Glass jars, containers, dishes, drinking glasses, and vases (any color)		
Corrugated cardboard/beverage containers	Call: 1-800-874-1301 for nearest drop-off locations. No city Curbside pick-up available.	
Grass clippings. Please mulch or compost.	City only collects curbside between 3/15 and 4/14. Place in a lawn bag – must have a City of Dallas adhesive grass collection tag (\$1.50).	
Household Hazardous Items (Paint, oil, pesticides, automotive fluids, batteries, pool and household chemicals)	Call Home Chemical Collection Center (H3) at 214-630-9160 for information and to schedule drop-off.	

Apartments – no curbside pickup

Materials	Notes	
Glass, aluminum, mixed paper	Take to IGLOO locations	No city Curbside Pick-up Available for Apartments.
Plastics, steel (tin cans)	Take to Oak Cliff or Dry Gulch Transfer Stations	
Paint, Oil, Pesticides, Automotive Fluids, Batteries, Pool, and Household Chemicals	Call H3 at: 214-630-9160	

Items not accepted:

- Food waste
- Containers stained with food, unless well-rinsed
- Wet paper products
- Styrofoam
- Waxed paper or cardboard
- Plate glass (windows or doors)
- Electronics
- Yard waste (grass trimmings, branches, leaves) please leave these items for the once-monthly Brush/Bulk Collection
